

Anaphylaxis Campaign: Small Grant Scheme

The Anaphylaxis Campaign supports small research projects being conducted to help improve the lives of those affected by severe allergy. A total of £5,000 per annum is available for U.K. based applicants in an open competition.

Criteria for funding

- Research proposals must meet the aims of the Anaphylaxis Campaign which are to meet the needs of those at risk of severe allergic reactions and help improve the lives of those affected by severe allergy
- Proposals will be accepted by U.K. based students currently completing an MSc, MA or PhD or an early career researcher (up to three years from completion of PhD)
- Bids can be made up to £5,000
- The Anaphylaxis Campaign will pay direct costs arising from the study only. These may include things like printing, postage, travel, consumables
- Research must be completed within one year, although projects of 18 months may also be considered.

Exclusions for funding

- Grants towards service provision or audit studies
- Grants purely for higher education, we do not pay course fees for degrees or subsistence costs
- Grants for work undertaken outside the U.K.
- Any indirect costs such as administrative or other overheads imposed by the university or other institution
- Costs associated with advertising and recruitment of staff
- 'Top up' funding for work supported by other funding bodies
- Costs to attend conferences.

Process for considering applications

Applicants should submit a three page application form, which should include a rationale for seeking funding from the Anaphylaxis Campaign, how the research meets the aims of the charity, the potential application of the research, a description of the research and anticipated costs. The application should contain enough detail for our scientific advisors to understand what research is being proposed.

The application form should also include confirmation of the support of the supervisor of the student or line manager of the early career researcher. Copies of materials to be used in the research and a CV of the researcher and supervisor/line manager should also be included.

Applications will be peer reviewed by members of our Board of Trustees and our Clinical and Scientific Panel.

Dissemination of scheme and funded projects

Funded projects will be announced on the Anaphylaxis Campaign website and newsletter.
